Prizes

- Trophies for the fastest Open and Women's crew.
- Gold medals for winners of each category provided 4 enter.
- Gold medals for fastest club/school second crew in each division provided at least 4 second crews race .
- Silver and Bronze medals provided there are more than 6 entries.
- Should a club/school second crew finish in the top 3 they will be awarded the appropriate medal for 2nd boats and the medals for the 1st boats will not be awarded.
- Victor Ludorum prize for the most successful club or school in both Open and Women's categories

Special notice

All Crews will race over 2 legs a total of 3,600m as follows:

- Boat from the pontoons, scull into the return lake and warm up
- Marshal in the return lake. When instructed paddle back onto the main lake through the bridge by the finish tower
- Paddle for 200m, start to race at the 1900m mark on the course ie 100m from the finish tower towards the course start.
- Race for 1800m towards the course start and finish racing at the 100m mark.
- Paddle until close to the start pontoons, turn and paddle to the other side of the course,.
- Race second leg from 100m to 1900m.
- Paddle back to the pontoons. Cooling down on the lake is NOT allowed. There is not enough space.
- Timings of divisions shown are indicative, these may change depending on entries received and conditions.
- All crews and especially coxes must be able to spin turn and respond immediately to instruction from umpires/ marshals. Any crew or cox showing dangerous incompetence may not be allowed to race.
- The event is reaching the maximum number of crews it can safely accommodate. We may need to reject some crews if we feel we cannot safely accommodate all the crews entered, and will advise what we have done if we have to do so.

Rules

Run under BR rules of racing. All boats MUST display BR standard identity codes, being three-letter code attributed to the club, together with a three-digit fleet number.

- No composite crews
- All athletes must scull for the club where they carry out their normal day to day training and all those registered with BIRO must scull for their nominated club.
- No doubling up.
- No more than 50% of J14 Crews (excl cox) may be J13.

Save in circumstances disclosed to the committee prior to the entry being made and accepted by them as exceptional, competitors must have been registered as School or Club members by the 1st November previous to the Head. The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without explanation, (BR rule 5.2.3(c)), and it will do so if it feels clubs/competitors are competing under "Flags of Convenience". Entries from Rowing Clubs will only be accepted where the membership is open to all young people wishing to learn to row or scull. If in doubt please contact Entry Secretary .

Entries

£60.00 Quads, £120.00 Octuples. Entries and Payment via BROE only, Cheques will not be accepted.

Closing date Weds 28 Feb 2018 at 12 noon. Entry fees will not be refunded if a crew withdraws after that date but BROE" will remain open for substitutions.

In the event of cancellation a proportion of the fee may be returned.
