Timings of divisions are indicative, these may change depending on entries received and conditions.

Prizes

- Trophies for the fastest Open and Women's crew.
- Gold medals for winners of each category provided 4 enter. Silver and Bronze medals provided where there are more than 6 entries.
- Gold medals for fastest club/school second, third or fourth crew in each division provided at least 4 crews race in that category.
- Victor Ludorum prize for the most successful club or school in both Open and Women's categories

Special notices

- All crews and especially coxes must be able to spin turn and respond immediately to instruction from umpires/marshals. Any crew or cox showing dangerous incompetence may not be allowed to race.
- The Head will **NOT** close entries until the published close of entries, but if the Head or an event is over-subscribed (i.e. it has reached the maximum number of crews it can safely accommodate) those clubs/schools which have a large number of entries in the Head or an event will be asked to withdraw or have some lower entries rejected in order to allow other clubs/schools to have at least one entry in the Head.
- The Crew Ranking Index along with the results from previous events will be used for positioning in the start order unless advised otherwise on the entry.
- For the purposes of issuing B and C prizes, where the event warrants issuing prizes, should a club/school have a number of crews in an event the fastest crew will be called the "A" crew and be placed accordingly in the "A" crew event, if "B", "C" etc crews the club/school second crew will be called the "B" crew and placed in the "B" events, the club/school third crew will be called the "C" crew and placed in the "C" events etc. Only one set of medals will be presented to a crew.

Rules

Run under BR rules of racing. All boats MUST display BR standard identity codes, being three-letter code attributed to the club, together with a three-digit fleet number.

- No composite crews
- All athletes must scull for the club where they carry out their normal day to day training and all those registered with BIRO must scull for their nominated club.
- No doubling up.
- No more than 50% of J14 Crews (excl cox) may be J13.No J12, or younger, athletes.
- Save in circumstances disclosed to the committee prior to the entry being made and accepted by them as exceptional, competitors must have been registered as School or Club members by the 1st November previous to the Head. The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without explanation, (BR rule 5.2.3(c)), and it will do so if it feels clubs/competitors are competing under "Flags of Convenience". Entries from Rowing Clubs will only be accepted where the membership is open to all young people wishing to learn to row or scull. If in doubt please contact Entry Secretary .

Entries

£60.00 Quads, £120.00 Octuples. Entries and Payment via BROE only, Cheques will not be accepted.

Closing date 8th March 2019 at 12 noon. Entry fees will not be refunded if a crew withdraws after that date.

In the event of cancellation a proportion of the fee may be returned.
